I have revised the staggered start and end of day times as detailed on the grid above. Please note, these timings, along with social distancing measures, will need to be strictly adhered to. If the plan is not followed, it may be necessary for me to lengthen the waiting times once again. Please bear in mind the latest tightening of C-19 measures from the Prime Minister.

It is crucial to remember that we all have a role to play to ensure that our children and school community remain safe. I have invited Community Police to attend Lower Breck Road as often as possible to aid with social distancing and parking as this is something that is beyond my control. I cannot stress enough that we are acting on current Government, Public Health and Local Authority guidelines. Every action we take is reasonable and carried out to try to ensure the safety of all at SMA.

Since the lockdown started in March, each of us will have had different experiences and we ask that everyone in our school community is respectful of each other and their individual feelings. If you are dropping off or picking your child up from school, we ask that you respect other people and comply with social distancing guidance. If it is possible, please walk your child to school to reduce congestion at the school gate. I must ask parents and carers to not gather and chat as this does increase the risk of bubbles crossing. **ONLY ONE HOUSEHOLD MEMBER SHOULD BRING CHILDREN TO SCHOOL.**

It is important that outside of school we all follow the government guidance around Covid-19, particularly the Stay at Home guidance below and do not bring your child into school: www.gov.uk/government/publications/covid-19-stay-at-home-guidance/stay-at-home-guidance-for-households-with-possible-coronavirus-covid-19-infection. If you do keep your child off school due to Covid-19 symptoms please ensure that you let us know this when you register your child's absence.

If your child is tested positive over the course of the weekend, you should email covid@st-margaretsanfield.liverpool.sch.uk to state their name, class and the date that the positive test was confirmed. **Please note this email address is only for informing the school of a positive pupil case of Covid during the weekend.** You will not receive a response from this address. All other reports of pupil illness should be carried out by calling the school office in the usual way.

If your child presents Covid-19 symptoms in school we will take your child to a safe area and contact you immediately to pick them up. **Please make sure that your emergency contact details are up to date and correct.** If your child does develop symptoms, you can seek advice from NHS 111 or at <https://www.nhs.uk/conditions/coronavirus-covid-19/check-if-you-have-coronavirus-symptoms/> or by phoning 111. It is vitally important that anyone who presents with Covid-19 symptoms get tested as soon as possible.

PE DAYS

PE kit bags are currently not permitted in school. Please check the information below for your child's two PE days. On these days, your child should come to school in their PE T-shirt with their school jumper or cardigan over. School PE shorts should be worn and plain black or navy joggers or leggings can be worn over or instead of, particularly as the weather turns colder. Children will no longer need to get changed back into their uniform after the PE lesson.

- 1W - Tuesday and Wednesday
- 2M - Monday and Thursday
- 2E - Monday and Wednesday
- Year 3 - Monday and Wednesday
- Year 4 - Monday and Tuesday
- Year 5 - Wednesday and Thursday
- Year 6 - Tuesday and Thursday
