This Week's Book Recommendation...

A firm favourite in many classrooms, *Room on the Broom* is a delightful rhyming picture book perfect for early primary children. A friendly witch and her cat take to the skies, picking up new animal friends along the way—but is there enough room on the broom for everyone?

With its catchy rhythm and repetition, the story is ideal for reading aloud and encourages children to join in and predict what happens next. The bright illustrations and gentle humour keep young readers engaged from start to finish.

We love this book because it promotes themes of friendship, teamwork, and inclusion, its engaging rhymes support early reading and language development and is suitable for ages 3-7, making it ideal for EYFS and KS1!
